WHY "CIS"?

"CIS" is abbreviation for "Companion-in-Service," referring to your significant other, most often your spouse. You might wonder why Lions International doesn't simply say "husband" or "wife" or "spouse." Why? Because it has to do with authorized travel expenses for the life partner of an International or District officer, his or her expenses at least partially paid for by

International when the officer travels on official Lions business and partner wants to accompany him or her.

In olden days, the legal terminology “spouse” in Lions International policy was okay because life partners were married. But now in modern days, live-in partners happen as a matter of course. Thus, to eliminate discrimination, International needed language in its policy to be inclusive not only of legally married spouses but also of unmarried partners as well. Thus, “Companion-in-Service,” or “CIS,” supplanted “spouse” in the rules.

By the same token, same-gender partners did not ordinarily refer to themselves as “husband,” “wife,” or “spouse,” preferring instead the term “partner.” Thus, Lions International invented the term “Partner-in-Service” but was later changed to “Companion-in-Service.”

Actual example: A District Governor-elect must go to District Governor’s School. International pays his or her way. If the partner wants to accompany him, International pays a portion of his or her way whether married or unmarried or same-gender.

At the Club level, no one gets such benefits. However, inherent in the term “Companion-in-Service” is the notion that a Lion’s Companion-in-Service is “In Service” *together* with his or her life partner. ROAR!!
