New Lions should know about International directors. They are elected at International conventions for two-year terms on International Board of Directors. A rare breed, Lion ID Bob is only the fourth Hawai'i Lion elected during my 33 Lions years and only the tenth ID overall from Hawai'i since Lions began here 96 years ago.

Elected before my time and with relentless energy when I joined were the late and great Past International Directors Lion K-Fat Hiramatsu, Lion Paul Fernandez, and Lion Shizuo Onishi.

The late Lion Herbert Watanabe [Waiakea LC] was elected at my first Lions International Convention in 1993 in Minneapolis. The late Lion PDG John Uyeno and I made the trip and were "automatic" delegates, convention formula of one per 25 members entitling EKLC to two.

The late Lion Melvin Nakamura [Manoa LC] was elected at my seventh convention in 2002 in Osaka. We had nine on this trip! EKLC Standing Policies stipulated highest-ranking Lions as delegates: Lion PDG John Uyeno and the late Lion Mike Furukawa did honors.

I digress here to talk story: We nine wanted to experience fabled Mount Fuji, nuclear bomb museums of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, EKLC's International Twin city of Shimonoseki, Great Wall of China [I reached the top, Yeaay!], Terra Cotta warriors of Xian, and Shanghai with its dazzling array of magnificently shaped skyscrapers. Who wouldn't want to go?! These were the good ol' days of the late and truly great International Convention ChairLion Joe Lum!

Lion Maurice Kahawai'i [Kona LC] was elected at my twelfth convention in 2007 in Chicago. Lion Ed Keopuhiwa and I were the only EK Lions and dutifully voted for Lion Maurice.

Finally, Lion Bob Lee [Honolulu Chinatown LC] was elected in 2022 in Montreal. I would've loved to make it my 20<sup>th</sup> International convention to vote for Lion Bob!

I join East Kaua'i Lions in wishing International Director, Lion Bob Lee, and his great CIS, Lion Pam, the greatest of Lionistic journeys in the years ahead. ROAR!!

# RECYCLED EYEGLASSES INTENDED FOR TROPICARE ARRIVE TOO LATE, HANDED OVER TO LIONS



Five hundred pairs of recycled eyeglasses shipped to Tropicare on Kaua'i arrived too late for use in its operations. They were turned over to Lion PDG Roy Nishida by Hawaii State Department of health for pick up at the Lihu'e office. He in turn planned for shipment to Baguio City Host Lions Club for its vision missions in northern Philippines.

Tropicare is a United States military operation. Military medical personnel go out to various communities throughout America to conduct medical operations thereby benefitting the

public with free medical services – vision, dental, general health. This operation also provides further intensive training for military medical personnel.

The operation is conducted for a few days in each community before moving on. Since this operation comes to Hawai'i but once a year and hits only certain islands from year to year, this was a rare "treat" for Kaua'i! Hawai'i State Department of Health worked with U. S. Department of Defense in facilitating services on Kaua'í.

#### **POLICY III – 100% ATTENDANCE; MAKE-UPS**

SECTION A: A member shall be recognized for 100% Attendance on the following basis:

- 1. He/she was present at all regular meetings.
- 2. He/she was absent from a regular meeting but made up the absence within thirteen days before and thirteen days after the absence by doing the following:
  - a. Attended another scheduled meeting—board, committee, or foundation meeting
  - b. Attended a regular meeting of another Lions Club
  - c. Participated in a project or activity of the Club or another Lions Club
  - d. Attended District, International convention
  - e. Attended scheduled function of this Club or another club
  - f. Attended scheduled function of zone, region, district, or International.

SECTION B: The following conditions shall be deemed excused absences and shall not count against 100% Attendance:

- 1. Illness or injury that prevents the member from being present at regular meeting.
- 2. Work at primary employment that prevents him/her from attending regular meeting. The board shall determine if work at other-than-primary employment is an excused absence.

SECTION C: It shall be the member's responsibility to report make-ups to the Club secretary by doing any of the following:

- 1. Inform him/her of participation in a scheduled activity of this or another Club or zone, region, district, or International.
- 2. Present visitor pocket name tag or equivalent thereof that indicates attendance at another club's activity.

SECTION D: Should a member achieve 100% attendance for one year from his/her induction date to induction date, he/she shall be awarded a Lions Clubs International 100% Attendance Award pin at an appropriate occasion.
