In 2014, while marching with her Girl Scout troop in the Manoa Lions Christmas Parade, she was asked to join the Lions. In 2015, she and her husband, Lion Dr. James Yamashita joined the Manoa Lions Club. Their three daughters and son-in-law joined soon after.

needed since resources are scarce and that a joint global service initiative could make a far greater impact in our communities than a single act. DG Gary proposed the joint food drive idea to the local service organizations after reading that September 23 is Hunger Action Day - a nationwide initiative to take action and raise awareness about hunger in our communities.
