With November being National Diabetes month, the Diabetes Awareness Committee would like to highlight District 50 Lions' engagement in our global cause of diabetes. With diabetes included as one of Lions International's 5 global causes, Lions serve to reduce the prevalence of diabetes and improve quality of life for those diagnosed with this chronic condition.

American Diabetes Association's Camp He Ola Ke Keiki

The American Diabetes Association held Camp He Ola Ke Keiki, a camp designed to support type 1 diabetic keiki and their families in a safe and nurturing environment from October 6th to the 9th at Camp Erdman. This year's camp was the first camp held in-person since 2019 and hosted 42 members of our community who live with and support children living with diabetes. The purpose of Camp He Ola Ke Keiki is to give children with diabetes the opportunity to form life-long bonds with other kids living with diabetes and to improve their diabetes management skills. This two-fold goal was certainly fulfilled at Camp He Ola Ke Keiki! Children participated in at least 4 hours of physical activity every day, engaging in activities like hiking, swimming and even the navigating a ropes course.

District 50 Lions supported this year's camp through assisting with the registration check in and check out processes along with financial contributions.
