
















#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE continued...

# Christmases in Pearl City by Lion Ira Tagawa

It was the wee hours of Christmas eve at Hoolala Street in Pearl City. Some of the residents' homes were nicely decorated with twinkling lights, wreaths, poinsettias and cartoon character boards. All was calm as Lion Leo woke up extra early that morning. Someone had been stealing vegetables and fruits from his yard, and he wanted to catch the culprit. Sure enough, he saw a silhouette of someone helping himself to lettuce, cucumbers, tomatoes and tangerines.



He looked like an ordinary guy, not a thief, so Lion Leo decided not to call the HPD. Lion Leo confronted the man, who had a sad, apologetic look. He explained that he was deeply sorry for helping himself to Lion Leo's prized vegetables. He said that he was a homeless person with 2 kids living in a van up on Waimano Home Road. He had recently lost his wife in an automobile accident when a drunk driver ran a red light. He also lost his job when his boss abandoned the company and left nothing for the employees. He was desperately trying his best to feed his young family.



Lion Leo was a compassionate soul who believed in helping others. He invited the man to a hearty breakfast, packed food for him and said that it was okay to help himself to whatever was growing in the yard. For the next several weeks, the man continued to harvest food from the garden. Always, he left thank you notes with inspirational messages. The notes would always end with the message: "Thank you for your kindness. I will repay you someday. God bless you." The charitable harvests stopped after several weeks. Lion Leo wondered what happened to the family.

Now it was Christmas eve again, a year later. A UPS delivery truck stopped at Lion Leo's residence to drop off several boxes. The boxes contained a bountiful Christmas feast. There was roast turkey, lau lau, ham, poke, sashimi, sushi, steak, tako, pumpkin pie, wine and Christmas gifts. A note attached to the boxes read:

"Dear Leo, when we first met, it was a most difficult time in my life. I was homeless with no savings, and working at odd jobs to feed my 2 kids. Life was hard, but I never gave up hope that someday I would again live a comfortable and happy life and keep my family fed. Thanks to you and other kind and compassionate souls, life got better. Pearl City Lions and strangers brought food for us. I used to pray every day after work at the Pearl City Congregational Church, grateful for the help that I received and hopeful for a brighter future for my kids. I did not attend Sunday church services because I

did not want anyone to see me in my old clothes. When I prayed in the evenings, I sometimes noticed a distinguished looking gentleman praying too. I avoided him because I was embarrassed. Apparently, he noticed me and found out all about me. He learned about my unfortunate turn of events and my struggles to earn a living. He was also touched that I had a close and loving family, and that my kids were honor students at Momilani Elementary School. It turned out that the gentleman was an executive at First Hawaiian Bank. He moved us into an apartment, gave us a new car, and hired me at the bank. After a few months, I was able to comfortably make ends meet. It was because of this gentleman and you that life is much better for us now. I think of your kind gestures every day. God bless you. With heartfelt gratitude, I wish you and your family a very joyous holidays,"

This is just a fictitious story, but I hope it conveys the true spirit of Christmas, a time for giving and appreciating all the bounties of life.
