

# Mililani High School

The early 1970s were a busy time for the budding Mililani community and the Lions who would help shape it. Mililani Lions Club was chartered in 1972. Mililani High School opened in the fall of 1973. In that very first school year, the Mililani Lions, still a fledgling club themselves, began recruiting Leos and applied for an official charter from Lions International, which they received on July 15,1974, making the Mililani Leo Club

one of the oldest organizations at Mililani High School. Mililani Leo Club is looking forward to celebrating its 50th charter anniversary in 2024.

Bouncing back from the pandemic, the Mililani Leo Club is rebuilding its list of annual projects, partnering with the Mililani Lions Club, whenever possible. Regular projects include quarterly book sales to support the Friends of the Mililani Public Library, participation in the City and

County of Honolulu's Adopt-a-Block Program, and the annual Mililani Holiday Parade and food drive, sponsored by the Mililani Lions Club.

Club President Ray Shiramizu, a four-year Leo Club member, enjoys opportunities like the annual Holiday Parade, where he can show pride in the Leo and Lion programs. He says, "Leo Club has taught me how to think outside the box when it comes to serving the community, especially during the pandemic when a lot of traditional service opportunities were lost." Ray and his club executive board are working hard to rebuild the program after two years of pandemic restrictions.

# **Spotlight on** Lion Lester Nip

Lion Cabinet Treasurer Lester Nip is a relatively new Lions member, joining the Koko Head Lions Club in October 2021, sponsored

by brother and DG Gary Nip. His spouse, Lorraine, also joined at the same time. They have two grown sons.

Lester graduated from St. Louis High School, and the University of Hawaii at Manoa, with a Bachelors degree in Business Administration, majoring in Accounting.

He worked in the accounting and audit fields for 41 years, a profession where financial integrity, reporting accuracy, and internal controls were paramount.

He retired from Hawaiian Electric after 31 years, where he held various positions in Finance, Accounting, Internal Audit, and IT. In earlier years, he was with: GTE Hawaiian Tel as Senior Accountant; Pioneer Federal Savings Bank as Controller, Assistant Vice President, and also Treasurer for its subsidiaries; and Touche Ross and Co., CPAs as Senior Auditor.

He was with the Ala Moana Jaycees a long time ago (about 35 years) and remembers leading the

logistics team for the Honolulu marathon, where fellow Jaycees procured materials and equipment for the race. That was quite a challenge.

When asked why he joined the Lions, his response was, "I joined Lions because DG Gary kept asking. DG Gary is very persistent (a good lesson for adding new members). However, having worked for 41 years with often, much overtime, little time was left for other pursuits. Perhaps this is the time to use my experience to help others and the community.

On a related note and speaking as a relatively new (maybe naïve) member, I am saddened to see the 20 / 80 rule in action, where a club may look like it has a lot of members on paper, but only about 20% of the club shows up for events and meetings, or hold office. That is, 20% of the members of the club are doing 80% of the work, maybe more. This rule seems to apply to every club I have met and talked with so far. We need to fix this.

When I was in the Jaycees (although it was a long time ago), our club had the 80 / 80 rule. That is, 80% of the members did 80% of the work, maybe more. I would like to see this for the Lions. I am committed to be tactfully persistent in asking new persons to become Lion members in 2023. I hope you will join me.

It was great weather for donations and nice to get outside! What a great way to help recycle and help our Kapolei community!






### **Lions Can COOK Book**

## "It's So Important To Check the Box"

"It's so important to check the box."

Lion Kyle Laconsay is a vibrant woman who lives life to the fullest. Her voice radiates with joy as she talks about being a longtime member of the Honolulu Lions club, and being president of the Honolulu Chapter of the National Federation of the Blind of Hawai'i.

Lion Kyle understands full well the importance of organ donation. Without the gift of corneal transplants and a liver transplant, she would not be able to give back her time and energy to the community today. Aside from being an active member with the Lions, she works at Ho'opono Services for the Blind, providing valuable skills and empathy to those in need.

Born and raised in San Francisco, Lion Kyle was blind

from a disease called keratoconus, which changes the shape of the cornea. She moved to the Aloha State and became involved with the local Lions after hearing of their mission and meeting Lions members. She said she admired the Lions' dedication to helping the blind see again and thought, "I want to do what they do!"

"I can't express how important the eye bank is," she said. "It changes lives."

Her journey with organ and tissue transplantation involves four corneal transplants to help correct her vision; one came through a donor from Pearl Harbor. Lion Kyle then unexpectedly required a different transplant a few years ago after she had reported feeling tired to her doctor and discovered that her immune system was attacking her liver. A liver transplant saved her life.

Lion Kyle is grateful every day for her cornea and organ donation angels. She has the chance to be there for her husband, children, friends and family thanks to the people who "checked the box" and made the commitment to becoming organ donors. Lion Kyle encourages everyone to consider becoming an organ donor.

"We shouldn't take it for granted," she said.



The Lions Eye Bank of Hawaii and Makana Foundation remains the primary focus and the major activity of the Hawaii Lions Foundation. Its primary objective is to remove corneal tissue for transplant or research.
