WEST KAUA'I LIONS HONOR TEN HONORARY CHARTER MEMBERS, FIVE WITH OVER 50 YEARS OF SERVICE, AT 85TH CHARTER ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION



West Kaua'i Lions, celebrating their 85th Charter Anniversary, were joined in a joyous, super gala affair by their fellow Lions from six other clubs – East Kaua'i, Kapa'a, Koloa, Kaua'i, Mana Loa Nimitz, and Lanai City Lions clubs.

Worthy of note was the presence of 100-yr-old Past District Governor, Lanai City Lion Tamo Mitsunaga, a revered Lion in all of District 50, now living in Kekaha with his daughter. Also present was Mana Loa Nimitz Lion Wendell Hosea, campaigning for the office of 2nd Vice District Governor, 2023-2024.

Dovetailing the history of West Kaua'i Lions Club with the history of District 50, Past District Governor Lion Eric Nordmeier cited Lanai City Lions Club being chartered at the same time – November 1937 – both clubs among the oldest in District 50, Honolulu Lions Club being the first to be chartered in September 1926.

A highlight was the celebration of ten Honorary Charter Members that included five Monarch Lions of 50+ years of Service – Lion Norman Hashisaka, 66 years; Lion Noboru Munechika, 55; Lion James Okada, 54; Lion Roy Miyake, 53; Lion Richard Ueoka, 51; Lion George Paiste, 38; Lion Brian Kimura, 36; Lion Malcolm Tam, 35; Lion Brian Yamase, 35; Lion Naoko Ho, 32 years of Service.

Boxes of books are marked for delivery to schools in Kilong and Betwagan barangay [districts] in the municipality of Sagada in Mountain Province on the most distant and loftiest summits of the main Philippine land mass, the island of Luzon.



These two screen shots, taken off a video, though lacking in clarity, dramatically portray "HARDSHIPS OF LIFE" in Philippines. The teachers, all smiles, head-carry the books uphill on a thirty-minute walk from highway to schools following the six-hour drive from Baguio City, personifying the value of these books to the communities.



Amazing story beginning with Pearl City Lions Club receiving a donation of 39 boxes of books from Manana Elementary School with the shipment to Baguio City Host Lions Club, underwritten by East Kaua'i Lions Club, hardy teachers bearing these books on an arduous trip atop a forever-winding summit road and hiking paths for the sake of happy children 6000 miles away from where the books began.
