China Walls Rescue May 30, 2023

On May 30th, Lion CareyAnne took her boys to check out the waves at China Walls. As they were standing there watching the waves come in, a group of 5 scuba divers had gotten into the water. 10 minutes later, you can see that the divers were starting to panic as they were pushed towards the side of the shelf. A guy ran up to grab a life jacket and went to the water. He and two surfers assisted the scuba divers out of the water. This guy, is known as Brian of China Walls. He said that he is at China Walls almost daily and uses the jacket he brings or the rescue tube that the Hawaii Kai Lions has placed at the top shelf. The rescue tube gets so much use that he has had to switch the tube with others from different locations to make sure that it can still serve its purpose.

Half an hour later, a group of 20year olds were not paying attention to the waves and 4 of them get wiped off their feet. Two were knocked into the water. "Grab the yellow tube! Grab the yellow tube!" Brian yells. CareyAnne and one of her sons runs up the shelf to grab and toss the yellow tube to him. Brian catches it and goes to get the onlookers out of the water. Brian and others who are regulars at China Walls use these yellow rescue tubes frequently. The yellow tubes definitely save lives.
