Vision Screening at Ka'elepulu Elem October 3, 2023



Good news. With Cecelia's efforts, we are able to coordinate a vision screening event at Ka'elepulu Elementary school in Enchanted Lakes, Kailua. With the assistance of Roberta Jenkins, D50 Vision Screening Chairperson, and thanks to her Mililani Lions Club, we will have an electronic vision tester and eye charts to be used to test the students.

The school has about 180 students. Lion CareyAnne is the Parent Community Network Center (PCNC) coordinator at the school. She will send out waivers to the parents to get a count of actual students to be tested. Tentative testing time will be from about 8:30 – 10:00am, however Lion volunteers should meet at 8am to set up. Please park in the inside parking island and go to the office to obtain a visitor pass. The screening will be held at the Multipurpose Room (MPR.)

Testing is on a workday in order to get to the students during school hours. So far the following Lions have signed up to volunteer: Lions Dan, Glenn, Cary, Karen, Cecelia and Clarence. Let us know if any other Pali Lion wishes to attend.

Club Leadership Positions (President, Immediate Past President and Vice Presidents

CLUB LEADERSHIP

Teamwork is one of the keys to successful club management. Club officers can collectively shape the way in which they work together that will be best for all concerned. Regardless of the way your club officer team works together, the leadership team should ensure that the club has leadership development goals and plans to achieve them. Your zone chairperson and other members of the district GLT can be a resource for your officer team in creating and implementing a leadership development plan. There are, however, specific responsibilities and areas of authority for each club officer. Using these as a guide, your leadership team can determine the most effective way to manage your club throughout the year.

President:

He/she is the chief executive officer of the club who presides at all meetings of the board of directors and the club. The president issues the call for regular meetings and special meetings of the board of directors and the club, and appoints the standing and special committees of the club while cooperating with chairpersons to ensure regular functioning and reporting of such committees. He/she sees that officers are elected as provided for by the constitution and by-laws, and cooperates as an active member of the district governor's advisor committee of the zone in which this club is located.

The club president has no absolute authority.

The president's authority to act must come from directives from the board of directors, the club as a whole, the club's constitution and by-laws, or the Standard Form Lions Club Constitution and By-Laws (LA-2).

Immediate Past President:

He/she officially greets members and their guests at club meetings, and represents the club in welcoming all new service-minded people in the community served by the club.

Vice President(s):

If the president is unable to perform the duties of his/her office for any reason, the vice president next in rank shall occupy his/her position and perform his/her duties with the same authority as the president. Each vice president shall, under the direction of the president, oversee the functioning of such committees of the club as the president designates.
