Guest Speaker Dr. Roger Ede at Pali Lions Meeting September 13, 2023

Pali Lions had the pleasure of seeing a power point presentation given by Dr. Ede, an optometrist and Lion with Hawaii Kai Lions. Without getting overly technical, the presentation basically emphasized the importance of vision screening of the early PreK group (age 3-5) to identify amblyopia risk factors (lazy eye) and refractive errors (primarily nearsightedness, farsightedness) and Elementary age children for refractive errors or other conditions that might affect academic and behavior development. Screening tools include the simple eye chart at 10' away and the more sophisticated instrument based infrared multiradial photoscreening.

After the power point presentation, we regrouped in the adjacent hall where Lion Gavin Hall of Kokohead Lions demonstrated the Plusoptix photoscreening device his club owns, and Lion Bud Jenkins of Mililani Lions demonstrated the use of SPOT which his club owns. Also attending was Lion Roberta Jenkins, D50 Vision Chair, who added that early detection can lead to a lifetime change in a child, and we Lions have the opportunity to make a difference in a child's life by screening for and bringing attention to those needs. She and Dr. Ede are on an advisory committee convened by the Dept of Health to establish protocols, training and data collection in accordance to ACT 37 that was signed into law by Governor Ige.

In addition to those mentioned, we also had guests from our Zone who wanted to hear Dr. Ede's presentation: Lions Julia and Tabitha from Kahaluu Lions, and DG CJ and spouse BJ Kalopodes of Kaneohe Lions. Additional guests from Kokohead Lions included Gavin's wife, Mana Taylor-Hall, their daughter and Lion Jaci.

Thanks to Lion Charles for picking up the pizzas (twice the normal amount he usually picks up) and to Lion Jay for bringing the drinks.

PDG Tokuo Tani Mar 4, 1935-Sep 5, 2023



Tokuo's life was filled with service to the community. He was appointed as a Board of Director at the Kahuku Community Hospital and was on Mayor Fasi's Advisory Committee on Law Enforcement Planning. He also gave his expertise and service to many other groups. The organization that stole his heart was the International Association of Lions Clubs. In 1963 his father-in-law sponsored him to join the Koolauloa Lions Club. In 1978 he became the then youngest District Governor of District 50 Hawaii Lions. He later joined the Kahaluu Lions Club which serviced communities closer to his home.

Of all of Tokuo's accomplishments, he is most proud of his work in the establishment of the Hawaii Lions Eye bank, with the intention of obtaining donated corneas for transplantation. Several thousands of people have been given the gift of sight though the eye bank.

His favorite pastimes were fishing, catching squid and traveling to Las Vegas (not in that order.)

Tokuo is survived by his wife, Agnes of nearly 61 years, his 3 children, Deborah, Gary, and Jason; 9 grandchildren and 3 greatgrandchildren. Services will be held on Oct 21 at 10:30 am at Hawaiian Memorial Park.

Secretary

He/she is under the and direction of the president and the board of directors, and is the liaison officer between the club, the district (single or sub and multiple) in which the club is located, and the association. The secretary:

• Submits regular monthly membership reports, service activity reports and other reports specified by the association.

•Cooperates with and serves as an active member of the district governor's advisory committee of the zone in which the club is located

· Submits reports upon request to the district governor's cabinet

• Has custody of and maintains general records of the club, including minutes of club and board meetings; attendance; committee appointments; elections; member information, addresses and telephone numbers of members; members club accounts

• Arranges for issuance, in cooperation with the treasurer, of quarterly or semi-annual statements to each member for dues and other financial obligations owed to the club, collects and turns dues

over to the club treasurer and obtains a receipt · Gives bond for the faithful discharge of his/her office in the sum and with surety as determined by the board of directors

 \cdot Delivers in a timely manner, at the end of his/her term, the general records of the club to his/her successor

Treasurer

• Receive all monies from the secretary and deposit the currency in a bank or banks recommended by the finance committee and approved by the board of directors

• Pay the club's obligations authorized by the board of directors. All checks and vouchers shall be signed by the treasurer and countersigned by one other officer, determined by the board of directors

• Have custody of and maintain general records of club receipts and disbursements

· Prepare and submit monthly and semi-annual financial reports to the board of directors of the club

• Give bond for the faithful discharge of his/her office in the sum and with surety as determined by the board of directors

 \cdot Deliver in a timely manner, at the end of his/her term, the financial accounts, funds and records of the club to his/her successor

Vision Screening at Ka'elepulu Elementary School October 3, 2023

Pali Lions conducted its first Vision Screening project in over a decade at Ka'elepulu Elementary School in Enchanted Lakes, Kailua. Lion CareyAnne, who works at the school, coordinated the event with the school principal and the regional nurse. VDG Lori offered to assist us by bringing her club's SPOT photoscreening device. Each child was screened with the equipment and if they passed, they were sent to the eye charts where other club members tested their farsightedness. In all, 92 students for Kindergarten to 6th grade were tested (about half the school enrollment) and 5 were referred to their optometrist. Thanks goes to Pali Lions volunteers Dan, Glenn, Clarence, Cecelia, CareyAnne, and Kahaluu Lion Tabitha and Manoa Lions Lori and Jim for all your help.
